OUR PROJECTS



2020 has been a singular year due to the global pandemic and its effects on our personal and professional lives. With the national confinement, we were forced to work from home but fortunately, at Prodesign, we have been able to continue with our projects and complete several tasks during that difficult period. We have been working on projects across various sectors. Residential projects include Les Promenades d'Helvetia and Anahita villas, Les Fascines/Vivea were office projects. Commercial projects included the brand new Li Wan Po outlet in Port Louis and an industrial/warehouse project for Fine Foods.

The coming year will surely be challenging as suggests the economic outlook but we remain optimistic for 2021.

Throughout 2020, several MEP engineers and site coordinators have been involved in the renovation of Maritim Resort & Spa, a major project for Prodesign. We have been working closely with contractors to complete the renovation in due time for the inauguration of the hotel. Our building services engineers have carried out the design of the new block and the BoH building fully on Revit using BIM 360. We have used Augmented Reality on site to check the buildability of our design, especially the chiller yard and the pump room.
